FAFSA-The Most Important Application

The FAFSA, Free Application for Federal Student Aid, is an important application you will fill out when thinking about attending college. The federal and state governments and universities use this application as their basis for awarding need-based aid.

Once a FAFSA has been received, an EFC, or Expected Family Contribution, is calculated. This number states what the federal government expects your family to contribute towards your college education.

Many students feel like their parents make too much money to fill this application out and that is not true. Even if you may not qualify for great amounts of scholarships or grants, this application is the only means of qualifying for student loans, work-study assistance, and many university awards.

This application is now available at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Once your parents receive their tax returns, fill out the FAFSA immediately! Do not wait until March 10th, the Indiana submission deadline, because servers do crash! Also, some colleges (Indiana colleges and

universities as well) require FAFSA filing earlier than the March 10th deadline. Check with your college of choice to make sure you don't miss out on a source of funds.

Even if your parents haven't received their tax returns, complete the FAFSA! It can be completed with anticipated income information and updated later.

Before a FAFSA can be submitted, it must be signed with a FSA ID. This is something both the student and one parent will create to sign the FAFSA. It is recommended to complete this step in advance of completing the FAFSA. Visit <https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa/filling-out/fsaid> to create your FSA ID now and keep it stored somewhere you can find later. Students and parents will keep this same FSA ID forever.

If you would like to get an idea of what your EFC is right now, you can use the tool called FAFSA4caster to get an estimate of your financial aid. This can be found at <https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa/estimate>

Types of Student Financial Aid

There are four main types of student financial aid. They are grants, scholarships, loans, and work study. Each of these types of aid are important in helping pay for a college education.

Grants are usually state or federal need-based aid. This means that the money is given to students whose families do not make enough money in the government's viewpoint to pay for a college education. Grants do not have to be paid back.

Scholarships also do not usually have to be paid back. One instance where scholarships may have to be repaid is when you, as the student, do not meet the stipulations of the scholarship. Scholarships are usually given on a merit, extracurricular, or community service basis. Scholarships typically require separate applications which could include simply basic identifying information or lengthy essays.

Student loans are one of the most notorious methods of paying for college. Even though they have a bad reputation, student loans are one of the most commonly used methods of paying for college. They are loans and you do have to pay them back, but they are at fairly low interest rates and allow you to pay them back over many years.

Work study is granted to students usually to finish out a financial aid package. This money is given to the school to support you getting an on-campus job. Money is tax-free up to a certain point. It also allows for employers to pay higher wages.

Boone County Cancer Society Scholarship

March 4, 2016

Open to graduating seniors who plan on pursuing a degree in the health care field. An application, transcript, and essay about future goals must be submitted by the date given above. The scholarships must be received by the date given above. Applications are available in the guidance office and on the guidance website.

Saint Mary of the Woods Music of Promise Scholarship

March 5, 2016

Open to graduating seniors from Western Boone who intend to pursue a career in the field of education. Application requires a completed application form, transcript, two letters of reference, parent/guardian letter, and essay on "What are your goals for a career in education?" Scholarship is in the amount of \$1000. Applications are available from the guidance office.

Tri Kappa Scholarships

March 15, 2016

Open to seniors who have at least a "C" average and have been accepted into a 2 or 4-year program. Scholarship amounts vary. Applications are available in the guidance office and online through the Western Boone guidance website under the "How can I pay for college" section.

Symphony at Sunset Music Award

March 15, 2016

Open to seniors who are pursuing a degree in music. A one time award of \$2,000 will be given to a student from Western Boone or Lebanon High Schools. Applicants must major or minor in music, complete the entire application including an audition which includes one classical piece and piece of the applicants choice. Jacob Shockley & Richard Penny Memorial Scholarship presented by Big O Tires of Lebanon

March 18, 2016

Open to seniors who plan on attending a technical or trade school to pursue training in a vocational/trade career. Ivy Tech and Vincennes are considered acceptable in this group as long as a vocational career is being pursued. March 18, 2016

Open to seniors attending a vocational or 2 year program (Ivy Tech/Vincennes is included). A statement describing yourself and why you feel qualified for the scholarship needs to be attached to the General Application that is available in the guidance office and on the guidance website. Scholarship is valued at \$500. Applications should be turned into Ms. Query in the guidance office by the deadline above.

Alpha Delta Kappa Education Scholarship

March 18, 2016

Open to graduating seniors who plan on studying education. The scholarship is based on scholastic performance, financial need, and personal achievement. Scholarship is valued at \$1,000. Applications are available in the guidance office and on the guidance website.

State Bank of Lizton Community Bankers Scholarship

March 23, 2016

Open to seniors who plan to enroll in a full-time program at a two- or four-year school in Indiana to study a business-related field such as accounting, finance, marketing, information technology, entrepreneurship, etc. Scholarship is valued at \$1,000. What specific plans/ideas do you have in order to make a difference in the lives of others?" Interviews may be conducted among finalists. Two \$1000 scholarships will be awarded. Xi Alpha Sorority Scholarship

March 24, 2016

Open to seniors who plan on attending a vocational school, college, or university. Applications are available in the guidance office or students can use the "General Scholarship Application" from the guidance website. A statement of 100 words or less must be included about why the student thinks he/she is deserving of this scholarship. A statement as to how the student plans to pay for college expenses must also be included. Scholarship is valued at \$500.

March 25, 2016

This scholarship is open to Western Boone seniors who will be pursuing a medical career. Applicants should include a statement as to why a career in the medical field is sought. The "General Application" will be used. That application is available on the guidance website and in the guidance office. The scholarship is valued at \$500.

Sugar Creek Arts Center Scholarship

March 25, 2016

Open to seniors who plan on pursuing a program of study in an art related career. Students should complete the "General Application" available on the guidance website or in the guidance office. Applicants may attach recommendation letters or supplemental materials such as an essay or photographs/copies of art work. Scholarship is valued at \$400.

Thorntown Kiwanis Scholarship

March 25, 2016

Open to seniors who have been active members of Western Boone's Key Club. The "General Application" that can be found on the guidance website or in the guidance office should be completed. A statement describing future goals and how Key Club International's core values have and will continue to be a part of the applicant's life should be attached. Scholarship is valued at \$500.

Western Boone Education Foundation Scholarships

March 30, 2016

The Western Boone Education Foundation has scholarships available from multiple groups and organizations that wish to recognize Western Boone students with scholarships as a way to promote furthering education. Beam Family Scholarship

Open to graduating seniors from Jackson Township. Financial need will be considered. Please indicate free/reduced lunch status on the application. Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.0 and submit an essay on the topic "What are my future goals and why I need financial assistance in meeting these goals?" Scholarship is valued at \$2,000 per year and may be renewable if funds are available and if the winner maintains a C average in college and submits transcripts by June 1st of each year to Superintendent Dr. Hendrix.

Boone REMC Community Fund, Inc. Operation Round Up Scholarship

Open to graduating seniors who plan on pursuing education at a vocational or trade school. Students must have minimum GPA of 2.0 and submit an essay on the topic, "What are my future goals using my vocational degree?" Scholarship is valued at \$1,000.

Duane Swisher Swimmer Scholarship

Open to seniors who have been a varsity-level swimmer. The winners must have good attendance according to the current varsity swim coach and display a strong work ethic, leadership skills, and a positive mental attitude. The application requires an essay be written over what a strong work ethic in the pool and the classroom means to the student. Scholarship is valued at \$250 and will be awarded to one male and one female student.

Earl Hoock Scholarship

Open to seniors who plan on studying in the fields of math, science, or engineering. Students with financial need and who will attend Purdue will be given preference, but these areas are not a requirement. Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 GPA. Two reference letters are required and one must be from a math or science teacher. Scholarship is valued at \$1,100.

Kent Poole Athletic Scholarship

Open to seniors who have participated in at least one varsity sport and displayed a positive mental attitude and leadership. Within the online application under "Extra Curricular Events", include a complete list of athletic participation. Scholarship is valued at \$250.

Natalie Duke Memorial Scholarship

Open to seniors who participate in athletics and/or art classes and have a GPA of 2.0 or higher. Applicants should have a positive attitude and have shown consistency in giving their best effort in everything and especially including others to do the same. Applicants should include all athletic and art participation in the "Extra Curricular Events" section of the application. Two scholarships are available for \$250 each.

Roscoe D. and J. Charlene Stewart Scholarship

Open to seniors who have a GPA of 2.0 or higher and attended Thorntown elementary. Applicants must upload a recommendation letter from a current or former teacher. Scholarship is valued at \$1,000

Ron Bush Scholarship

Open to seniors who are 4H members in Boone County and have a 2.0 GPA or higher. Students must upload a 1 page essay on the topic, "How has 4-H provided me direction toward my future?" Candidates will be interviewed. Scholarship is valued at \$2,000.

Sandy Heffner Education Scholarship

Open to seniors who plan on studying education and have a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Preference will be given to applicants who have been affected by cancer and who are active in church/social organizations. An essay must be uploaded on the topic "How will a degree in education help you change the life of a child?" A recommendation letter from a teacher or non-family member must also be uploaded. Scholarship is valued at \$425.

Saxton Schrier Alumni Scholarship

Open to seniors who have a minimum GPA of 3.0. This scholarship was established by two former Western Boone Alumni, John Saxton and Josh Schrier. The goal in offering this scholarship is to encourage and reward a WeBo senior whose aspirations, drive, and risk-taking will take them far beyond Boone County. Preference will be given to students studying a humanity or social science subject and who are attending a college or university out of state. Applicants must provide two recommendation letters (one must be from an English teacher), proof of application/acceptance to school, transcripts/test scores, and a personal statement of at least 500 words about future goals.

Consumer and Family Science/Health Care Scholarship

April 1, 2016

Open to Boone county residents who plan on majoring in Consumer and Family Science or a health care field. Applications are available online at www.extension.purdue.edu/boone and in the guidance office. Scholarship is valued at \$1,000.

Pheasants Forever Scholarship

April 7, 2016

Open to students who will further the promotion of habitat stewardship by majoring in biology, botany, entomology, conservation law enforcement, environmental engineering or science, forestry, horticulture, parks management, natural resources, or wildlife. Applicants should have a 3.0 GPA and submit a short cover letter of introduction along with a 250-500 word essay on "In your opinion what is the most important local environmental issue and how would you remedy it?"
